Star of Texas Awarded to Smith

ATPI Executive Director Mark Muray had a surprise agenda item at the Winter Conference business meeting: a new Star of Texas winner.

The latest recipient, Chad Smith, has served at Texas A&M University-Commerce as an associate professor of photography since 2003. In that time, Smith has supported ATPI by hosting multiple summer workshops, judged contests and taught at the Winter Conference, and coordinated the Texas High School Shoot-Out. Recently, he encouraged the Texas Photographic Society to start an international student contest.

"Chad is one of the best friends that photography education has," Murray said. "For years Chad has shown up whenever and wherever we've asked, often with college students in tow, to help with teaching, judging, critiquing or just helping move things around if that's what we needed. His support for photography students and teachers in Texas is legendary."

The award, which is the association's highest honor, recognizes contributions to photographic education in Texas.

Still Time to Register for Summer Workshop Instructor-Only Sessions Head Back to Fort Worth

Spots are still available for this year's ATPI Summer Workshop for Instructors Only. The workshop, which runs June 12-15, features three tracks for participants to choose from.

In "The Magic of Light," instructors will master tabletop photography, high key and low key lighting, and studio shoots. ATPI Vice President Erica Garcia (Navasota HS) and Ian McVea (Arlington Martin HS) will teach this session.

The "Photo Teaching Bootcamp" will focus on assignment ideas as well as hands-on practice. Camera handling, composition, workflow and storytelling will all be concepts explored in the class. Jeff Grimm (retired), John Knaur (retired) and Andrea Schlepphorst (Byron Nelson HS, Trophy Club) will lead this class.

Instructors looking to boost their video skills can enroll in "Video 101." Matt Koby (Dickinson HS) will take participants through everything from interviews and B-roll to cinematography.

This year, there will also be a field trip to the Amon Carter Museum. Current exhibits include Christina Fernandez, a Los Angeles-based photographer who focuses on migration and labor, and works from Richard Avedon's *In the American West*. There will also be a night photography session offered.


Trimble Tech HS will host the workshop. Registration is \$275 and includes instruction, all the snacks and beverages you can consume, lunches and one dinner, and prizes. PPA Master Photographer Shares Advice for Shooting Portraits

In the fall, I had the wonderful opportunity to work with WPPI certified and PPA Master Photographer Phaneendra Gud, known as "PG" by his friends and clients. PG is a standout photographer due to his use of bold color, negative space and beautiful light to create the most beautiful portraits which are hard to forget.PG had some very good advice for refining skills when shooting portraits:

Undoubtedly the most important takeawy for students is to think before you click. Really think about what it is that you're feeling in your mind and your heart that you want to communicate visually. Often times we rush to get our exposure correct and our focus sharp and then we just push the button. Take time to visualize and to think about what it is that could make this portrait exceptional.

Utilize natural shapes and the form of your subject, lines in your background to create dynamic compositions.Diagonals triangles, repeating patterns, and dominant mass are all key to successful compositions.

Lead the eye by contrast and utilize color to create emotion. Monochromatic colors evoke calming feelings. Analogous color models create energy and complementary colors create energy on a higher level with more contrast.

Remember to always enhance the good and diminish the bad. Every element in the image supports the mood. Look, see, and enjoy, especially the Gud stuff.

Registration Open for Fall Photo Workshop


In cooperation with ATPI, Friesens will host a Fall Photography Workshop this fall at the International Bowling Museum & Hall of Fame, located in Arlington.
